Kim Campbell served as the 19th Prime Minister of Canada in 1993.

Prior to that, she was Minister of Justice and Minister of Defence. Between 1996 and 2000 she was a general council of Canada in Los Angeles. From 1999 to 2003 she chaired the Council of Women World Leaders. She is one of the founders of the World Leadership Alliance-Club de Madrid - an independent organization whose main purpose is to strengthen democracy in the world. At different times Campbell has served as its Interim President, Vice President and then from 2004 – 2006, she served as Secretary General of the organization. From 2003 until 2005 she served as President of the International Women's Forum. She is in the advisory councils of various international organizations such as Arab Democracy Foundation, Middle Powers Initiative and Asia Society in New York. Today, Ms Campbell devotes most of her time to “Peter Lougheed Leadership College” at the University of Alberta. She also chairs the board of World Movement for Democracy and is a trustee at the International Centre for the Study of Radicalisation and Political Violence.
